Tacoma, Wash., May 14, 2015 – Bullying continues to be a real problem in Washington State schools, and with the advent of social media it is no longer a problem that stays at school. Cyberbullies are able to harass 24/7 through social networking sites and web enabled devices. According to the Teen Online & Wireless Safety Survey 81% of young people think bullying online is easier to get away with than bullying in person. 68% of teens agree that cyber bullying is a serious problem but only 1 in 10 victims will inform a parent or trusted adult of their abuse.
